There are many other "active" groups such as, Tai Chi, Walking Football, Golf, Walking/Striders, Walking/Hikers and Walking to spot Wildlife!


There are several intellectual groups such as Current Affairs, Egyptology, Heritage and Culture, Music Appreciation and many more.

The original 6.5 acres of the Pightle are well covered with trees. A mixture of self-sown hawthorn, elder, chestnut etc. plus a large number of trees donated to celebrate an anniversary or to commemorate a loved one. In between there are some areas left as meadows to encourage wildflowers.



The riverbank has been opened up over the years with just a few trees left for balance. Several Black Poplars were planted early on and include the rare female variety. They are in the Northeast corner on the riverbank.



The new area of 3.5 acres is divided by the path to the Willow Bridge. To the South, next to Castle Mount, is Giles Gardens, to be planted mostly with fruit and nut trees to encourage wildlife. To the North, East of the Cricket Ground is McNish Wood, where we will plant larger trees that are not common in the original Pightle.

Over the last two years we have planted many fruit trees in Giles Gardens, each well staked, mulched, and tagged.

The tag #s are recorded alongside details of the tree using What-3-Words.

We need regular finance to pay for items like grass cutting, maintaining the paths, planting new bulbs and trees as well as the annual insurance that has to be paid.


