e have recently been awarded a Grant from the HDC **Biodiversity For All** project. The Grant is to develop a wetland "Bog Garden" within the Pightle. This will provide a different type of habitat, and we hope to increase the number of frogs, newts, snakes etc that thrive in wetland areas.

The Grant followed on from an Ecological Survey of the entire site carried out by HDC Ecologists last year, which has provided detailed information on the flora and fauna in the Pightle, and ideas on how we can better support nature. We are extremely grateful for this support from our District Council.



The Bog Garden will be developed in Giles Gardens, down towards the Moorings and to the South side of the path to the Willow Bridge.

Over the next few months, we will excavate the area, add a gravel drainage layer under a membrane, refill with soil, and then plant a wide selection of "boggy" plants.



We aim to make the new garden easily accessible to everyone.


