"Encore! Concerts for all, big and small" meet in Eaton Socon Church on the third Thursday of the month to bring live music to everyone from babies to grandparents in a relaxed and informal environment. An ancient Round Barrow near Sharps Barns!



Did you visit the round barrow, built in stone and covered in earth, near Hail Weston on October 23rd? This amazing structure was built in a small wood near farmland in the same style as ancient round barrows built over 3,000 years ago. The soil over the structure is seeded and will soon provide a green grass covering.

To access the site a track leads from the cottages at Sharps Barns, on the road to Hail Weston. The track is just inside the Bedfordshire border and Eaton Socon parish, although the actual barrow is just across the county boundary in Cambridgeshire. This round barrow is a modern interpretation of ancient burial mounds - for more info on the site see the website - www.sacredstones.co.uk

Bedfordshire Day - 27/28th November

Watch for the Bedfordshire flags flying at the original county boundaries and on Eaton Socon Village Green. This event links Eaton Socon with villages throughout Bedfordshire who wish to celebrate the former county. Until 1965 Eaton Socon and Eaton Ford were still in Bedfordshire and the church registers still go to Bedford Archives.

Free food and Christmas decorations in the Pightle

YES – there is free food for birds as the trees are laden with berries but please do not help yourself unless you know what you are collecting. Some berries are poisonous to humans but the birds will feast on the berries in the winter months, so why not wander around and listen to the variety of birds – both native and winter visitors.



YES – teasels and holly can be found in the Pightle and you are welcome to collect some for your Christmas decorations but please leave some for others. Teasels look fantastic in any decoration, either left in their natural state or sprayed silver with a little glitter added to make them sparkle.



The hay has now been cut, bulbs planted and the Pightle has been prepared for the winter months by the trustees and volunteers. In these days of getting fit by walking or using outside spaces as an outdoor gym you may wish to help our growing band of volunteers. Regular tasks include grass cutting, trimming back overhanging vegetation, litter picking and in the winter months laying bark chippings on muddy paths.

A recent visitor who is also a hedge layer has offered to lay the hedge on the north side, next to the field of cows. It seems that the hedge is now of the right maturity and size and it is likely that the project will start in December when all the leaves have fallen. Two volunteers from Paxton Pit will undertake this exciting venture and they are happy to show others how to carry out this dying craft.



Your "Library at Home Service"

If you are stuck at home and would like to read a book then why not ask the library for help - Cambridgeshire Libraries offer a home delivery service for people who can no longer use the library because of mobility problems, ill health or because they have full time (unpaid) caring duties. Alfred Rowlett – A Local Character

You may or may not have seen the blue plaque in Eaton Ford that mentions Alfred Rowlett, known by many villagers as Doc Rowlett, a herbalist and antique dealer. There are many stories surrounding Doc Rowlett, including his finding of Bunyan's anvil which was shaped in a particular way and mounted on a large iron structure. He is recalled as having found it in a scrapyard in Avenue Rd, St Neots, but other villagers are not so sure that it is genuine. He was a great storyteller and Sunday evenings were often spent with the Addingtons in Ford House drinking whisky and telling stories.



However, his antiques always intrigued the children and in the small windows of his house in Eaton Ford would be placed small antique ornaments. But what was not known until very recently was his connection with the Horniman Museum in Forest Hill, London. This museum opened in 1901 and some of Rowlett's curios are in the museum. Alfred Rowlett had various jobs throughout his life – in the censuses he was described as a horsekeeper, a general labourer, and a bricklayer's labourer while later in life villagers recall him sweeping the roads.

But at some point in his life he found that he could sell some curios from the countryside, including charms that could cure illnesses, cooking pots, articles used in country games, Valentine cards and various other curiosities. A researcher in the museum recently contacted ESCA and asked about his life as they were trying to find out more about this fascinating character. We were able to tell them more about his life and family and exactly where he lived from the 1920s until his death in 1948.


