Saving our Prickly Friends

Have you spotted a hedgehog recently? Hedgehogs are in decline and need our help. If you spot one out and about in daylight it may be ill or hungry. They should hibernate during the winter but if they are under 450grams they will not wake up from their hibernation.

You can help by:

- leaving gaps (20-30cms) in your garden fence to allow the hedgehogs to wander between gardens
- leave water and food like cat biscuits outside
- take care when driving

At Shepreth Hedgehog Hospital the little hogs are fed on cat biscuits or tinned meaty cat or dog food in a jelly base and when they are strong enough they are placed back in the wild.
