Happy New Year. Why not make one of your New Year Resolutions to join the team who look after the Pightle? We are a small team of friendly volunteers and anyone who can spare an hour or two and use a pair of secateurs will be welcome.

The tasks vary throughout the year, and we meet every Monday morning between 9am and 11am for general upkeep of the Pightle with occasional sessions for larger projects on other days. We have a wide variety of equipment, tools, and safety gear.

Winter: time to get the mowers serviced for the next season; paths to be protected with bark chippings; weeding of our hedges and around the younger trees; pruning hedges; completing projects before the frosts make the ground undiggable.



Spring: once the frosts are over, we can start planting trees again; later, we'll mow the paths and lawn areas for the first time; we might paint preservative on the fences; projects continue





Summer: mostly mowing the paths and clearing the ever-growing brambles from the paths; watering the trees that aren't yet established; creating new paths and open areas.

Autumn: a chance to progress with projects that we are too busy to do for the rest of the year; fixing fences, installing benches, kissing gates etc; a good time to plant



trees; the last mowing of the paths.

But we are not just a volunteer brokerage system...

We have an active **Community Car Scheme** based in our office, run by a great team of volunteer drivers and administrators.



This service is for anyone who needs to make essential journeys (e.g. for

appointments etc) where no suitable public transport exists, and for individuals with mobility difficulties. And we cover not only the local area of St Neots, but further afield such as Cambridge, Peterborough, & Bedford Hospitals.

If you think the Community Car Scheme may be able to help you, or you know of anyone in the St Neots area who could benefit from it, please get in touch with the office.

Our drivers all have one thing in common – their dedication to the community of St Neots and their willingness to give up their free time to support that community. Drivers use their own vehicles and are all DBS checked; journeys cost just 45p a mile (min £2) plus a £1 booking fee.
