There are several intellectual groups such as Current Affairs, Egyptology, Heritage and Culture, Music Appreciation and many more.



# ST NEOTS MAN CAVE

With the first year complete, the St Neots Mancave is becoming a big part of the community support network. The year has seen us play a huge part in the St Neots Festival, creating a number of the signs and probably the most photographed blocks St Neots has ever had.
