Do you qualify for a **Warm Front Grant?**

As many as 7,600 homes in the Huntingdonshire district are believed to be eligible for grants for heating and insulation improvements, according to Eaga Partnership Ltd, who manage the government funded Warm Front scheme.

Under the initiative, which is funded by the Department for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, qualifying households could receive up to \pounds 2,700 to help pay for energy saving measures, such as loft insulation, cavity wall insulation, draught proofing, central heating and heating repairs.

To qualify for a grant, householders should be in receipt of an income or disability benefit and live in their own home or rent it from a private landlord. Those likely to be eligible are householders who are over the age of 60, who receive pension credit, people who suffer from a long term illness or disability, have a child under 16, or are pregnant.

To apply for a grant, call the Warm Front helpline free on **0800 316 2814** (quoting reference MK547) and a trained advisor will guide you through the process. Lines are open Monday to Friday 8am-6pm and 9am to 5pm on Saturdays.

Biodiversity Success!

Alison Pearson provides an insight to the Anglia in Bloom Special Biodiversity Award

Much to our surprise and delight Sudbury Meadow was nominated for, and secured, the Special Award for Biodiversity in this year's Anglia in Bloom. We were judged against a least five other sites (I forgot to count as I was so surprised at hearing our name called out!), one of which was a SSSI (Site of Special Scientific Interest). So what prompted the judges to choose Sudbury Meadow?

According to the Anglia in Bloom guidelines, the overall aim of this award is "..to recognise the efforts made by communities in supporting and increasing biodiversity in domestic and community gardens and within parks, gardens, allotments and other green spaces managed by local authorities." Below are brief details of the judging criteria and how Sudbury Meadow meets them.

- Consideration of the positive (and negative) impact of selected plants and other features on local biodiversity. *The policy at Sudbury Meadow is to use plants that are native to the area or will not spread into the wider environment.*
- Evidence of engaging and educating the wider community on the topic of biodiversity as relevant to the local area. Several groups of young people have helped us and we are about to install six species information boards at the site, in addition to our main information board.

Cricket news

The club celebrated its most successful season in its history both on and off the field in 2007 with the 1st team gaining promotion as champions in both Saturday and Sunday leagues whilst also adding the East Beds trophy to the cabinet in night competitions. The young lads won the U13 & U14 with the U11 finishing runners up in their respective league.

For next season we will be launching Eaton Socon AAA(3A's) All Abilities Academy for the youngsters where we can focus on more specific coaching and training using our new net facilities. Our new scoreboard has just been completed and will be unveiled during our cricketforce weekend April 4,5 & 6 and hope to see there, Mike will be in touch.



- Evidence of the consideration given to specific wildlife that needs support within the local area, and the steps taken to implement supporting planting schemes. The local Biodiversity Action Plan was consulted right at the start of the project and Song Thrush is a specified species that has benefited at Sudbury Meadow.
- A healthy balance of planting styles incorporating a variety of habitats to support a wide range of wildlife and also sustainable approaches to bedding schemes. In addition to maintaining the meadow, we have increased the hedgerow cover, planted a shrubbery of native species, planted a new orchard and created three demonstration wildlife gardens. We use recycled materials where possible and have a composting area.
- Quality and appropriateness of planting design and presentation. *We try, not always successfully!*

So there we are, an award winning local authority green space, managed by a community group. You are welcome to join us.

Hidden Secrets of the Eaton Parish

Now its time to work on the December issue and it occured to me that there must be other people in similar situations, who have little time between work and family to get to know the neighbourhood. So in the next few issues I plan to highlight interesting locations that caught my eye on our trip

Mary Fielding Smith was born on July 21, 1801. She was the sixth child of John Fielding a Bedfordshire farmer-preacher, and Rachel Ibbotson. John preached in the little Methodist Church in Honidon, In 1834, Mary emigrated to Toronto, Canada to join her brother and her sister. They joined to the newly formed Church of the Later day Saints (LDS) in 1836, Mary moved to Kirtland, Ohio the following year to join the larger body of the church and married Hyrum Smith, a founder member of the LDS and became stepmother to his children, who included the future church patriarch John Smith. She was widowed in 1844 when a mob killed her husband. Mary died in Salt Lake City, Utah at the home of her second husband Heber C. Kimball, on September 21, 1852

Firstly all cats from Cats Protection are neutered or spayed, vaccinated, blood tested and microchipped and are ready to go to their new homes immediately, unlike kittens whose owners will have to pay for the various vet treatments which would be well over £100. Also an adult cat is safer on the roads and more confident in a new home. Furthermore an adult cat will only have to be kept in for 2 weeks and can then go outside, wheras kittens can not go outside at all for nearly 6 months. Another benefit of an adult cat is that a new owner who is not at home during the day need not worry as the cat is likely to settle down and sleep until the owner is home and will revolve its life around you. A kitten needs feeding every 4 hours and should have human company as much as possible in order to socialise it. The cats in the St Neots and District Branch are looking for loving new homes now and come in all shapes, sizes, colours and temperaments. Booklet News and Reviews

If you want a Christmas present with a local flavour why not buy one of our history booklets. The two newest booklets were produced in May and June. In May the long awaited book on the Village Lanes was available and if you would like to know about life in Cow Lane, Peppercorns Lane and School Lane or Ackerman Street, Woods Lane and Mill Lane then this years booklet may answer some of those questions. More than 180 pages focus on the lanes that make up the old village centre of Eaton Socon with lots of information including the Millers Arms, the Falcon Pub, the Cock Pub (later the Manor House) the glove factory, the River Mill, the Eaton Socon Academy, River Farm and lots more. Read about the Thody family who farmed some of the land for over 100 years, the Peppercorn family at The Manor House, the Hobson family at the Mill, the vicars family who built a house near Castle Hills and lots more.

In June the Church celebrated 75 years of its rebuilding and rededication in June 1932 after the disastrous fire that destroyed the church in February 1930. For the celebration the fire booklet was revised with new pictures and more information kindly researched by Rosemary Galloway. So a big Thank You is given to Rosemary who retyped the booklet while Sue was compiling the Lanes booklet. The new booklet is named 'Recalling 75 years On'.
