St Mary's Eaton Socon Clock Appeal

A big thank you to everyone who contributed to the church bells appeal. These are now retuned and are ringing once again. Now, it is the turn of the church clock, which is permanently fixed at 12 o'clock which is not very helpful if you wish to know the right time. The clock has been inspected annually and for several years there has been advice that various parts were wearing out and would need replacement. Now has come the crunch and although some electrical work has been carried out to ensure that no problems exist in that area – the clock is now in urgent need of replacement parts and an overhaul. The cost of this work will be over £2,000 with VAT.

Scams – beware of hoax police calls

Beware of men phoning and claiming to be police officers. One victim was told that a male in custody had given their address and another reported that she was asked to give her card details, as they had been cloned.

After becoming suspicious one victim contacted the Police, who confirmed that the name and collar number did not exist. In all cases no money has been taken from the victims accounts but please be alert and do not trust anyone over the phone, without trying to check who exactly they are.

Never give bank cards, cash or valuables to anyone at the door, even if they say they are from your bank or the police.

The fraudsters can be very persuasive and often victims don't realise they have been scammed, always make sure you have ended the call before dialling 999.

Sudbury Meadow

Winter will be biting at the heels of autumn by the time you read this and the colourful leaves at Sudbury Meadow will have fallen. Summer visiting birds will have been replaced by winter ones, such as Redwings and Fieldfares. We may even get Waxwings again if the Guelder Rose berries are still around.

The year at Sudbury Meadow seems to have flown by with some dramatic changes to the site in that time. No more Lombardy Poplar trees at the front of the site, a relief for local residents during stormy weather. However, we are left with the major task of creating a new area at the

front of the site, which is proving a challenge due to re-growth from the poplar roots and trunk remains (to say nothing of new street light cabling just below the surface!). Weed seeds have also germinated. Friends of Sudbury Meadow is working with site owner, HDC, to come up with a solution, but in the meantime we apologise for the rather untidy front of the site. It was a much better summer for butterflies at Sudbury Meadow than in 2013. Gatekeepers were in abundance during July, along with Small and Large Whites, Small Tortoiseshells and Meadow Browns. Smaller numbers of Peacock, Small Skipper, Holly Blue, Common Blue, Speckled Wood and even Ringlet were also seen feeding on both the meadow flowers and those

in our wildlife gardens. Meadow grasses are important food plants for several butterfly caterpillars (Small Skipper, Gatekeeper, Meadow Brown and Ringlet), which is why we try not to cut all the meadow in June/July when the butterflies are laying eggs. By delaying cutting until September and also leaving areas uncut, hopefully some caterpillars or pupae will survive over winter. Volunteers are the key to Sudbury Meadow's success as a wildlife site. We have occasional help from HDC Countryside Services, but otherwise we need all the volunteers we can get! Weeding, hedge cutting, propagating plants,

all the volunteers we can get! Weeding, hedge cutting, propagating plants, growing vegetables, orchard care, making bird and insect nest boxes, operating mechanical equipment and helping on the committee are just some of the activities we need help with. The Pightle Millennium Green -Eaton Socon

Once more autumn has come and activity in the Pightle is visibly settling down ready for the cold months ahead – although we seem to be enjoying an unnaturally warm November. A few weeks ago, we met some of our regular berry-pickers making the most of the Pightle's



abundance of fruit – blackberries being the most obvious, but look around and you can find elderberries, sloes and haws. Our apple trees continue to produce a healthy crop of russets; rather bitter in September, they come in to their own later. One of the saddest autumn sights is a fruit tree with its produce lying on the ground rotting away; please remember you're more than welcome to help yourselves to ours! We'd also be interested to hear what becomes of all that fruit – some has fed my family with crumbles and jams, have you any more adventurous recipes, we wonder?

Autumn is the time for getting many of the more mundane jobs done, and we've had both volunteers and Community Payback involved in carrying out repairs, removing ivy from the trees, cutting back overhanging growth and generally improving the Pightle all round. It's really encouraging to see some of the youngsters, when given support and motivation, really getting stuck in and enjoying learning new skills. Our bulb-planters have stocked various areas up with many hundreds of English bluebells and narcissi, and you'll have seen that the meadow area has had some more extensive work done; the surface has been primed with wild flower seeds ready for next year, and several locations have had holes dug and refilled with topsoil ready for tree-planting. Why do we need to do this? It's certainly not obvious now but back in the Pightle's history, it was first a gravel pit then a dump for ash from the old coal-fired Little Barford power station. Over time the ash has set into hard lumps, which is not conducive to roots growing, so it needs digging out and breaking up. While it's hard work, it serves as a reminder of how far the Pightle has come over the years!

Wishing you all a very happy Christmas, and hoping you'll enjoy a very colourful show in the Pightle next spring!
