

News from the Pightle

As I sit here writing this in February I am sure that we are longing for Spring after these cold winter days. The days are drawing out and on odd occasions, there is a touch of Spring in the air. Catching one of these moments one afternoon walking the dogs, really gave me a lift. It is one of the blessings of having dogs, and going out daily, I see sights and hear sounds that energise me, and make me smile, even laugh! Yes I know it isn't as great when it is pouring down with rain, and cold, but even on those days the walk is good. We are told there is a decline in the number of sparrows, well I think they must be all in the hedgerows in the Ouse Meadows, along the back lane, and in 'The Pightle' the noise they are making is astonishing, I looked into the bramble bushes and there appeared to be hundreds of little brown birds, twitter, tweeting, in very high spirits, ready for nest building. All over The Pightle' the birds are active, finding mates and preparing their nests, I have seen Ring Doves carrying nesting materials.

In January we were honoured to have four new trees planted in The Pightle. 'Celebration Trees' were planted to celebrate the 'Golden Anniversaries' of Sue and Barry Durham (a Cherry Tree) and for Joan and Roy Foley (a Rowan Tree). A Cherry Tree was planted for Miriam and Tony Ingle who have celebrated their 'Diamond Anniversary'. On the same day a fruiting Pear tree was planted to replace the mature fruiting pear tree cut down when the flood defence work started near the Barley Mow in Eaton Ford. We have been informed by the Environment Agency that three Pear trees were planted near the Barley Mow but these will not produce pears so a fruiting tree was donated and planted in The Pightle. All of the trees planted will flower and are fruiting, so will provide food for birds and insects in 'The Pightle'. We are developing quite a beautiful arboretum to the front of 'The Pightle' and it will be wonderful as the trees bloom and mature.

We will once again be having a 'Trim and Tidy' in May and we hope that you might like to come along and help out. This is not hard work and you can meet new people and help to maintain this natural area for everyone to share. The Pightle is along the back path, near the Cricket Field so why not wander through the field, enjoy the natural area and sit by the river.






